## **CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes**

### **Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)**

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

This Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) describes the activities undertaken during the program year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023 using Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds granted to the Township of Cherry Hill by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Activities and accomplishments described in this year's report primarily benefitted low-income and moderate-income residents.

A complete draft of this report was made available for public review and comment for a 15-day period beginning September 12, 2023 and ending September 27, 2023. The availability of the report was publicly advertised consistent with the provisions of the Cherry Hill Township Citizen Participation Plan. The completed document is available at the Department of Community Development, on the Township website, at the Township library, and at Township Clerk's office.

Cherry Hill made significant progress in carrying out its strategic plan and action plan during the 2022 program year, despite having to catchup on activities that were stalled during the pandemic and/or made more challenging due to the pandemic. During PY 2022, the ARHAT Program acquired and rehabilitated 2 deed-restricted affordable housing units, the Handy Helper program provided home repairs to 61 senior/disabled homeowners, the Township removed architectural barriers for seniors and disabled persons at 5 Township intersections in the public right of way, the Cherry Hill Food pantry assisted 777 persons in the region, the Senior Bus program provided rides to a recorded 65 residents, and the Side-by-Side Domestic Violence Team assisted 88 individuals.

These "regular" CDBG activities were augmented by special Covid-response activities. The Township completed its CARES Act Rental and Mortgage Assistance Program, assisting 13 renters and 1 property owner during PY 2022, and provided grant assistance to a non-profit for needed improvements to a group home facility for 5 persons with disabilities. Lastly, CV planning and environmental review activities took place during PY 2022 laying the ground work for a Food Pantry site improvement project slated for PY 2023. The Township remained under the planning and administration and public services caps.

It was a successful 2022 Program Year.

**Assess how the jurisdiction’s use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.**

CDBG funds used during PY 2022 addressed high priority needs identified in the Annual Action Plan and the Con Plan, specifically the needs for **decent housing, suitable living environment, and provision of public services to low and moderate income persons**. The accomplishment data reported is from the PR-23 but adjusted to match the PR-03, which is closer to reflecting the true program year implementation. The tables above do not reflect CV project accomplishments.

**Decent Housing.** The Handy Helper program provided minor home repairs to 61 income eligible senior and disabled households funds during the 2022 Fiscal Year using 2019 and 2020 funds (Activities 341 & 355). This made decent housing more sustainable for low and moderate income residents, allowing them to live in dignity and independence, while at the same time helping to preserve the Township's housing stock. The ARHAT Program acquired and/or rehabbed 2 units for moderate income rental housing, 303 Barclay Walk and 508 Barclay Walk, using 2021 and 2022 funds (Activity 371 & 380). This increased the availability of quality, affordable permanent and fair housing to moderate income families.

**Removal of Architectural Barriers-Suitable Living Environment:** The Township removed architectural barriers to accessibility with 2021 funds (Activity 372), by installing 16 ADA-compliant curb cuts at 5 street and sidewalk intersections along Pennsylvania Avenue: Virginia Avenue, Connecticut Avenue, New Hampshire Avenue, Rhode Island Avenue, and Vermont Avenue. The curb cuts furthered the program five-year goal 125 sidewalk-curb cuts. This benefitted seniors and disabled residents by removing architectural barriers. Additionally, during PY 2022, the Township approved a substantial amendment to aggregate some of the smaller ‘public facilities’ projects into larger public facilities projects. While no accomplishments are showing in the table for ‘Area Benefit Eligible Public Facility’ planning and environmental review is underway for a park improvement project in an eligible neighborhood, anticipated to take place in PY 2023.

**Services to Low and Moderate Income Residents:** The Township’ Senior Bus Program, Activity 383 (2022 funds) , provided transportation service for more than 65 seniors and disabled residents of the Township for medical, shopping and cultural activities. This provided access to facilities and services for low and moderate income residents and reduced resident isolation. The Township provided funds to the Police Department for the Side-by-Side Domestic Violence Response Team Program, Activity 367 and 384 (2021 & 2022), which provided critical services to low and moderate income residents by being a support network for victims of domestic abuse. Also, the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, Activity 386 (2021) provided critical food and services to 777 low and moderate income residents in the region.

Cherry Hill Township continues to provide an array of services to all families and individuals of various racial and ethnic groups ensuring equal and fair housing rights and opportunities to services that serve and meet HUD's national objectives. Additionally, a reported number of people who identified or chose not to identify as classified in the above chart chose "other-665" and "Hispanic only -2." These additional people brings the actual number of assisted by CDBG programs to **6094**.

**Narrative**

The CDBG totals above include \$811,159.35 of unexpended funds from previous years, the new CDBG grant funds of \$423,294.00, plus an additional \$145,081.00 in Program Income available from Housing Rehabilitation projects. The Township also expended affordable housing trust funds in the amount of \$168,034. An unexpended CDBG amount of \$481,980.35 and AHTF amount of \$76,650.50 carried forward into the 2023 program year.

The Township also had an additional \$831,585 in CDBG-CV funding available, and expended \$425,577.80 of those funds in the 2021 program year. In 2022, of the remaining \$406,007.20 balance of funds, an additional \$137,060.07 were expended to help mitigate the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The remainder of the unexpended funds of \$268,947.13 will carry forward into the 2023 program year.

**Narrative**

All funding was spent on limited clientele populations, qualifying under the Low- and Moderate-Income National Objective, such as Handy Helper Home Repair program, Food pantry, Senior bus program, Side by Side Domestic Violence program, removal of architectural barriers and affordable housing. Planned activities for 2023 program year include projects in eligible areas, including Still Neighborhood Park improvements.



## Leveraging

**Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.**

Leveraged funds allows the Township and our subrecipients to provide more programs benefitting low and moderate income persons than would otherwise be possible. Below are some examples of how leveraging CDBG funds with local funds, State tax incentives, and other resources has resulted in more impactful programs.

**ARHAT Program** - The leveraging of resources is critical to ARHAT's ability to acquire and maintain quality and affordable dwelling units to qualified households. Specifically, CDBG funds are leveraged with local funding for unit acquisition, operations, and tax abatements. In PY2022, the Township married CDBG funds with the Township's Affordable Housing Trust Fund (AHTF) monies to acquire units for affordable housing. Additionally, the Township pays the salary of the ARHAT Housing Administrator, who oversees the program on a day-to-day basis, income qualifies tenants, manages the units, out of the Township's operational budget. Additionally, Township Community Development staff assist ARHAT by receipting rental payments and fielding phone calls from existing or prospective tenants, and the Housing Administrator uses Township resources in the Community Development office, such as office, computers, printer, supplies, etc. From time to time, the Township's rental housing inspector assists the ARHAT housing administrator with property management issues and assessment of potential units for acquisition. ARHAT benefits from a Township tax abatement with reduced taxes on the units. It is the leveraging of all of these resources that make it possible for ARHAT's non-profit program to be sustainable. Otherwise, the cost of acquiring, maintaining, and paying HOA fees and real estate taxes, and staff costs, would outweigh the amounts of rent received from tenants and the program would not be sustainable.

**Senior Bus Program**- CDBG funds support a large portion of the salary of the bus drivers; the Township pays for the remaining salary costs, gas, vehicle maintenance, and staff time managing the program out of the Township's operating budget. Additionally, in the past, new vehicles were acquired with the capital budget. It is the leveraging of funds that allows this program to have a larger impact, by reaching residents in the expanse of the Township (24 square miles).

**Cherry Hill Food Pantry** - CDBG funds were used to help offset operating costs of the Food pantry. The Pantry leveraged these funds by receiving private food donations, by assistance from a large number of volunteers who dedicate their time at the Food Pantry receiving, organizing, and distributing food, as well as by applying for grants for needed items such as large freezers for food storage on site, etc. It is the leveraging of funds and resources that makes the pantry feasible.

**Handy Helper Program** – While CDBG funds are the main source of funds for rehabilitation work and staff costs to implement the program, CDBG funds are leveraged with the Township's operational budget, which pays for other staff time involved (balance of program’s staff costs, contractor procurement by the Town's purchasing department, financial management by the Town's Controller Department, etc.).

**Public Facilities Projects** - CDBG funds were leveraged with local operating and capital budget funds for public rights of way projects to address the needs of providing suitable living environments, by supporting projects that benefit seniors and the disabled by removing architectural barriers and benefitting qualifying low and moderate areas of Cherry Hill. Rather than charging staff time to activity delivery, Township paid for public works, purchasing, and financial departments staff time to implement ADA projects in public rights of way in PY 2022.

**Township Land** - Most of the Township’s parkland is under Green Acres and is heavily restricted for parks and open space only. The Township is currently in the process of pursuing the removal of two former tax title parcels on the ROSI, for the purpose of augmenting land dedicated to owner-occupied affordable housing, as part of a joint project with Habitat for Humanity.

**Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.**

**Housing Acquisition.** For PY 2022, Cherry Hill Township had a goal of acquiring 3 affordable units with CDBG funds, which fell short by 1 unit. The challenges experienced involved extremely high market prices for dwelling units, as well as the competitive nature of the housing market; ARHAT was frequently outbid on submitted offers to purchase units.

**Housing Rehabilitation.** Handy Helper Home Repair Program assisted 61 persons during PY 2022, using 2019 and 2020 funds (Activities 341 & 355). For the 2021 Single Family Housing Rehabilitation Program, it is our understanding that it was a challenge for the Camden County Improvement authority, which is a subrecipient who administers the Township’s CDBG-funded Housing Improvement Program, to procure good, qualified and reliable contractors to conduct single family dwelling housing rehabilitation work. Therefore, progress was not made in PY 2022 on more extensive single family home improvement projects with CDBG funds.

**Rental Assistance.** For the 2020 CV rental and mortgage assistance activity, 13 households received rental assistance and 1 household received mortgage assistance (Activity 363) during PY 2022. The numbers are not included in the table above, as the Program is a CV activity. The biggest problem encountered is that there were an abundance of households who need long-term housing assistance, rather than just emergency assistance due to Covid-related setbacks. The demand for rental assistance could not always be met by the program guidelines.

Additional affordable housing activities (homeless housing, special needs housing) were accomplished through our County ESG partners.

**Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.**

**Housing Acquisition.** The extremely high costs of housing and competitive market has only reinforced the need to increase the supply and variety of affordable housing opportunities for low and moderate income residents in the Township. The difference in how the future will be impacted in future annual action plans is that, despite this need, the Township may not use CDBG for acquisition of affordable housing as much in the future. The Township must use its available resources in the most prudent and efficient manner. The Township has a substantial amount of monies in its Affordable Housing Trust Fund that it can only use for affordable housing activities, while CDBG funds can be used to address a variety objectives. Therefore, the Township will likely focus CDBG on other types of eligible activities that assist our low and moderate income residents.

**Housing Rehabilitation.** A substantial amendment during PY 2022 recently reduced the amount allocated to the 2021 Single Family Rehabilitation activity by \$100,000. This has been a highly successful activity in the past; it is desirous for the Housing Improvement Program to continue to be available to eligible Township households - - through CDBG and HOME. However, if limited progress is made in expending the remaining CDBG funds, this will be an activity that will be evaluated again for reallocation, given CDBG requirements for timeliness of expenditure of funds.

**Narrative Information**

There are two CDBG housing activities where income by family size was required to determine eligibility for the activity, including Handy Helper Home Repair and ARHAT Program. For Handy Helper: there were 61 owner-occupied households that were beneficiaries of the program, consisting of 45 extremely low, 13 low, and 3 moderate-income households. (It should be noted that the PR-23 Report is not populating the 2022 beneficiaries from Activity #355, 2020 Handy Helper program, in the table above, as the box in IDIS to change the year of accomplishments was not checked; therefore, some accomplishments were inadvertently reported under 2020 PY, rather than 2022 PY. However, the PR-03 report shows the correct accomplishments). For ARHAT (Activity 371 & 380, there were 2 renter-occupied households that benefitted, consisting of 2 moderate-income households. Therefore, 63 income-eligible households were served.

Additionally, CV funds for IDIS Activity # 363 Mortgage and Rental Assistance aided 14 households during PY 2022: 12 extremely low income, 2 low income. CV accomplishments are not included in Table 13 above.

A more detailed breakdown of beneficiary income information is attached in the PR-03 by Activity, which includes CDBG Beneficiaries by Income Category for housing and non-housing based on expenditures during the program year. The PR-03 is instrumental in understanding accomplishments, as some prior year funds were used during the program year and for some programs, like Handy Helper, the accomplishments were inadvertently reported during the grant year in IDIS, rather than the 2022 program year, so are not pulling into the PR-23 report correctly)

**Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:**

### **Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs**

The Township coordinates with the Southern New Jersey Four County Continuum of Care, Camden County Homeless Network Planning Committee and Camden County HOME Consortium, who conducts ESG needs assessments and planning for the entire County.

### **Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons**

The Township coordinates with the Southern New Jersey Four County Continuum of Care, Camden County Homeless Network Planning Committee and Camden County HOME Consortium, who conducts ESG needs assessments and planning for the entire County.

### **Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs**

In PY2022, the Township of Cherry Hill provided financial support to a number of activities that assist low-income people to prevent homelessness, including the following:

1. CV- Mortgage and Rental Assistance to assist residents to remaining housed and sheltered either in their homes or a rental unit. During the 2022 program period, 14 households were assisted and 35 LMI persons benefited from the assistance. For the program entirety, a total of 49 households and 114 LMI persons benefitted from the assistance and \$380,826.29 was expended to assist families to stay in their homes.
2. Acquisition of two ARHAT Program housing rental units to assist with affordable housing objectives.
3. Financial support for the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, which provides groceries, fresh produce, dairy, meat, blood pressure, and blood sugar screenings to alleviate hunger and improve health of Camden County residents, which helps to ease low-income individuals and families to

lessen their household burdens and helps persons who are homeless or likely to become homeless.

4. Continued financial support for the Side-by-Side Program, a support network for victims of domestic abuse, where victims are matched with a counselor who guides them through the process from the point of the initial incident through any legal process.

Additionally, during PY 2022, the Township hired a consultant to help develop and implement affordability assistance programs that will be funded with the Township's Affordable Housing Trust Funds; the programs will be implemented in PY 2023.

To supplement the Township's goals of acquiring additional units, the Township continues to develop relationships with several non-profit organizations. For example, the Township forged a relationship with Habitat for Humanity to acquire units to rehab and deed restrict for affordable housing, using Affordable Housing Trust Fund monies. The Township is also developing a relationship with Volunteers of America who is anticipated to take over an approved development project for a facility for senior housing and supportive/special needs, which will provide permanent supportive housing to individuals with development disabilities. The majority of the individuals will be at or below 30% AMI income levels.

**Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again**

The Township coordinates with the Southern New Jersey Four County Continuum of Care, Camden County Homeless Network Planning Committee and Camden County HOME Consortium, who conducts ESG needs assessments and planning for the entire County.

## **CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)**

### **Actions taken to address the needs of public housing**

The Township of Cherry Hill does not have a Public Housing Authority, nor does it have any conventional public housing complexes.

The Township is aware of the Camden County Public Housing Office's activities and reviewed a copy of the Office's Streamlined 5-Year Plan in preparing the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan and all Annual Action Plans.

### **Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership**

While not specific to public housing tenants/residents, the Township recently hired a consultant to develop an affordability assistance program using the Township's Affordable Housing Trust Funds. It is anticipated that types of affordability assistance programs will include down payment and/or closing cost assistance and special assessment assistance (for owners of units that are part of a Homeowner's Association subject to a fee or special assessments). It is expected that the affordability assistance programs will commence during PY 2023.

### **Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs**

The Township does not have a Public Housing Authority (PHA). There are no troubled PHAs within the Township.

### **CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)**

**Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)**

The municipalities in the State of New Jersey have a constitutional obligation to provide affordable housing and Cherry Hill Township has received a Third Round Judgment of Repose from the Superior Court of NJ - Camden County in 2016. The Township is implementing its Housing Element of its Master Plan to provide maintain, build and rehabilitate 2,829 affordable housing units prior to 2025. To the extent that land use controls or growth limitations would otherwise have negative effects on providing affordable housing, the Township has engaged in a series of redevelopment and zoning overlay initiatives to create 500+ NEW affordable housing unit opportunities between 2015 and 2025. Affordable housing opportunities are also captured through the collection of Housing Impact Fees and Non-Residential Development fees, which are used towards the Township's housing acquisition, housing improvement program, as well for other funding mechanisms (such as subsidies for market-to-affordable and 100% inclusionary developments). The Township has proactively stepped into civil foreclosure proceedings of existing affordable units to safeguard the affordability of units for the future.

The Township also implements a reduced tax assessment given to deed-restricted units (State statute) and uses an abatement program for all homeowners who have homes 20 years or older. This abatement encourages homeowners to invest in their homes, without being unduly taxed (for five years) for the improvements made to their property. Building code compliance and property maintenance provisions have been strengthened through local legislation, which requires all vacant and abandoned properties to register with the Township. All of these initiatives, in tandem, work to encourage residential investment and its ultimate return.

### **Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

During PY 2022, the Cherry Hill Zoning Board granted a use variance and site plan approval to the Cherry Hill Food Pantry to operate in a zoning district where the use is not a permitted use in the zone. Additionally, with CDBG funds, the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, Activity 386 (2021), provided critical food and services to 777 low and moderate income residents in the region.

The Township continues to make a concerted effort to listen and understand the needs of the community and ensure that the Township CDBG Annual Funds and CV funds are responsive to those needs. This includes prioritizing affordable housing production/maintenance, rental/mortgage assistance programs and working with local social service agencies to increase the support for crucial public services in the

Township.

**Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

Cherry Hill requires the use of lead-safe practices and other actions aimed at preventing lead poisoning. Contractors performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 must be certified and must follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination. Under the CDBG Handy Helper and rehabilitation programs, lead-safe practices have been underway.

Cherry Hill provides the “Protect Your Family from Lead in Your Home” lead-based paint pamphlet. This pamphlet is provided to the applicant at the time he/she receives an application.

Also, under NJ law, homeowners must provide disclosure of known lead-based paint hazards to any potential buyer and all pre-1978 rental dwelling units must be inspected for lead-based paint hazards (unless otherwise exempt under the law). In Cherry Hill, rental dwelling units falling under the scope of the statute shall be subject to a visual inspection for lead-based hazards of all interior spaces within dwellings, including common areas, such as hallways and basements. Non-exempt units shall be inspected for lead-based paint hazards every 3 years, or upon tenant turnover, whichever is earlier. However, an inspection upon tenant turnover is not required if the owner has a valid lead-safe certificate.

**Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

Cherry Hill provided CDBG funds in PY 2022 to a variety programs that will help to reduce the number of poverty level persons and families. These programs are a priority for the Township as identified in the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan:

- Non-profit Assistance - Cherry Hill Food Pantry;
- Transportation for senior and disabled residents;
- Advocacy for victims of domestic violence;
- CV Rental and Mortgage Assistance

- The ARHAT Program to provide affordable rental housing to low and moderate-income households

One of the most important tools in reducing poverty is to decrease the cost of housing. High housing costs reduce the ability of families to pay for other essential needs, such as food, clothing, and education. Additionally, the Township has commenced working with the Cherry Hill Food Pantry to address issues of food insecurity. The food pantry supports persons who are homeless, unemployed, and persons who are employed, but their pay is insufficient to meet their needs.

**Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Department of Community Development oversees planning, zoning, housing, and various programs for the Township. The Department is the primary administrative agency for the Cherry Hill Township CDBG programs. The Department is responsible for spearheading inter-department and public input on proposed plans and activities, preparing the 5-year Consolidated Plan and annual actions plans, overseeing expenditures under the program, and preparing the Consolidated Annual Performance & Evaluation Reports (CAPERs).

**Partners/Subrecipients.** Community Development engaged subrecipients and other municipal departments to evaluate needs, priorities, challenges, and performance of the program. This was particularly helpful during the development of the annual action plan this year.

**Consultants.** During PY 2022, the Department used the assistance of a CDBG consultant, Triad Associates, to help the Department carry out the program, recognizing that additional assistance was needed after a long-term staffer who was responsible for the CDBG Program, left the Township. Additionally, outside of CDBG, the Township hired an affordable housing implementation consultant, CPG&H, to help create more deed-restricted affordable units and to develop an affordability assistance program using the Township's Affordable Housing Trust Funds. It is anticipated that types of affordability assistance programs will include down payment and/or closing cost assistance and special assessment assistance (for owners of units that are part of a Homeowner's Association that are subject to a fee or special assessments). It is expected that the affordability assistance programs will commence during PY 2023.

**Program Modifications.** There have been some policy changes to monitor subrecipients' timely implementation of activities. Previously, the Department required quarterly reports of accomplishments from our subrecipients. We are now requiring subrecipients to provide monthly accomplishments in order to ensure activities are proceeding as anticipated and that we have needed demographic

statistics. We are finding that it keeps everyone accountable and on track and it is easier to monitor activity progress and to be able to report accomplishments in IDIS. Also, for the Handy Helper program, prior to Covid, the Town's rental inspector managed the program, but he was over-extended. After Covid, the Township hired a new employee, Vandi-koi Lahi, to manage the Handy Helper program. The Department developed a checklist for the Handy Helper program to ensure compliance all of the program and HUD's requirements.

**Additional Training/Education.** The new Community Development Deputy Director completed an IDIS Primer and IDIS basics course sponsored by the National Community Development Association, CAPER best practices training, and WISER training courses. The Handy Helper program manager has also taken WISER training courses.

#### **Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Township implemented the following strategies and actions during PY2022 to address identified obstacles to meeting underserved needs. These strategies have remained in effect to guide the CBDG program to increase coordination between agencies:

- Conducted outreach to non-profits, such as the Cherry Hill Food Pantry and Habitat for Humanity, to develop partnerships to enhance coordination in meeting underserved needs
- Conducted outreach to County ESG partners, seeking assistance in instances of homeless Cherry Hill families
- Coordination with the Camden County Homeless Network Planning Committee and Camden County HOME Consortium, who conducts ESG needs assessments and planning for the entire County.
- Continued implementation of programs to address COVID-19 related needs, such as non-profit assistance (Bancroft) and CV-rental and mortgage assistance
- Worked with the Department Public Works and Engineering and Parks and Recreation to assess CIP projects to better serve low- and moderate-income communities;
- Continue to prioritize services to the elderly and special needs populations through the Handy Helper and Senior Bus program; and
- Provided bilingual staff and developed translated materials for zoning enforcement and court matters
- Explored funding opportunities from federal, state, and private resources to address needs of the underserved;
- Leveraged resources to better match resources to needs

**Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)**

Cherry Hill Township continues to take the following actions to address traditional and emerging barriers to affordable housing.

- **Affordability:**

High market rate rental and homeownership costs and a shortage of affordable rental units in the Township all contribute to a lack of affordability. The municipality has not raised taxes in nearly a decade to offset tax increases from other entities such as the state, county, and school district. The Township has also adopted an updated Housing Plan identifying potential locations for new affordable housing opportunities, adopted redevelopment plans that have included nearly 200 new affordable housing units that are currently under construction or soon to be, and we have continued to use CDBG and AHTF funds to purchase and rehabilitate existing condominiums in Cherry Hill to rent to low- and moderate-income families.

The affordability of both owner occupied and rental housing remain the highest priority needs.

- **Homeownership:**

The Township has taken steps to promote homeownership throughout Cherry Hill Township by advocating the use of first-time home buyer programs the Camden County Department of Community Development. Additionally, the Township recently hired a consultant, CPG&H to develop an affordability assistance program using the Township's Affordable Housing Trust Funds. It is anticipated that types of affordability assistance programs will include down payment and/or closing cost assistance and special assessment assistance (for owners of units that are part of a Homeowner's Association that are subject to a fee or special assessments). It is expected that the affordability assistance programs will commence during PY 2023. Additionally, the Township recently assisted Habitat for Humanity, by funding a recent purchase of a dwelling for homeownership by a low and/or moderate income household, with funds from AHTF.

- **Rental Units:**

The Township continues to support our local non-profit, Affordable Rental Housing at Tavistock (ARHAT), by managing the rental of all units, as well as the acquisition of new units. We have also adopted affordable and inclusionary housing ordinances to ensure that all new home

construction for sale and rent includes either moderately priced housing units or affordable rental units.

- Accessibility:

The Township addresses issues regarding housing as well as many other barriers for the disabled.

The Township's road program has sought to improve accessibility within our neighborhoods by systematically upgrading roads and intersections to be ADA compliant, allowing safe access around those neighborhoods for our disabled and elderly residents. We have also provided services such as our Handy Helper program that provides small grants to elderly residents to make their homes more accessible by upgrading railings, installing ramps, and other such accessibility improvements.

- Homelessness:

The Township through the HOME Consortium is funding many agencies that help to address and prevent homelessness.

- General Fair Housing Issues:

Cherry Hill has seen a change in the racial makeup of our community over the years. We are becoming a more diverse community and the Township is doing all it can to celebrate that diversity and ensure that Cherry Hill remains a place where all people have access to safe and affordable housing opportunities. The affordable housing ordinance includes the requirement to create an affirmative marketing plan to be sure that advertisements of our new, affordable units are reaching out to all members of our communities. It includes a targeted approach that seeks to reach those members of our communities that are least likely to apply.

## **CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230**

**Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements**

The Township's standards and procedures for compliance monitoring are designed to ensure that:

- 1) Objectives of the National Affordable Housing Act are met, and
- 2) Program activities are progressing in compliance with the specifications and schedule for each program, and
- 3) Recipients are in compliance with other applicable laws, implementing regulations, and with the requirements to affirmatively further fair housing and minimize displacement of low-income households.

The Township continued to carry out monitoring activities and internal audits to ensure that it complies with all HUD and CDBG program requirements. The Community Development Department collects monthly accomplishments from its subrecipients and has conducted site visits to its Subrecipients. The Township of Cherry Hill has followed the procedures and requirements published by HUD.

The Township worked closely with particular entities in the execution and monitoring of the programs described in the Action Plan and an expanded list of agencies that have partnered to address the impacts of the coronavirus pandemic. The principal organizations, their particular roles, and the relationship they have with the Township are described in the Institutional Structure section of the 2022 Action Plan.

Action Plan activities were monitored through the use of checklists and forms to facilitate uniform monitoring. Fiscal monitoring included review and approval of budgets, compliance with Grant Agreements, approval of vouchers and reviews of fiscal reports and sub-recipient audits.

**Minority Business Outreach for Federal Funding** - The Township encourages participation by minority-owned businesses in CDBG assisted activities and maintains records concerning the participation of minority-owned and women-owned businesses to assess the results of its efforts and to complete the semiannual "Minority Business Enterprise Report" to HUD. Qualified minority contractors are encouraged to bid on properties participating in the Housing Rehabilitation Program.

**Comprehensive Planning Requirements** - To ensure compliance with the comprehensive planning requirements of the Consolidated Plan process, the Township reviews the process on an ongoing basis. The review ensures compliance with federal requirements concerning citizen participation and consistency of actions taken with those specified in the "Citizen Participation Plan." Records documenting actions taken are maintained for each program year.

**Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)**

**Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.**

The Township of Cherry Hill placed the draft CAPER document on public display for the required 15 days from September 12, 2023 through September 27, 2023. Additionally, the draft CAPER was put on public display on the Township's website and the public notice was both posted on the website and in the local paper, *The Courier Post*, Township library, and the Clerk's office.

A copy of the advertisement is provided as an attachment to this report.

Comments from the public and staff were received during the comment period and noted.

**CR-45 - CDBG 91.520(c)**

**Specify the nature of, and reasons for, any changes in the jurisdiction's program objectives and indications of how the jurisdiction would change its programs as a result of its experiences.**

Ongoing assessments of community needs, as well as success and failures of the Township's CDBG program in addressing those needs suggest that no significant changes are needed in the program's objectives, with the exception of the following:

**Housing Acquisition.** Future annual action plans may change in that the Township may not use CDBG for acquisition of affordable housing as much in the future, as the Township must use its available resources in the most prudent and efficient manner. The Township has a substantial amount of funds in its Affordable Housing Trust Fund that can only be used for affordable housing, whereas CDBG funds can address a variety of low and moderate income needs. Therefore, the Township will likely focus CDBG on other types of eligible activities that assist our low and moderate income residents.

**HIP Program.** Also, there could be a change to the Single Family Rehabilitation Program, as procuring good and reliable contractors to conduct single family dwelling housing rehabilitation work has been a challenge for the Camden County Improvement Authority (CCIA), which is a subrecipient who administers the Township’s CDBG-funded Housing Improvement Program. A substantial amendment during PY 2022 recently reduced the amount allocated to its Single Family Housing Rehabilitation activity. This has been a highly successful activity in the past so we would like to see it continue to be available to the Township’s residents when HOME Program is not feasible to address rehabilitation needs. However, if our quarterly evaluation indicates that no or limited progress has been made in expending these funds, this will be an activity that will be evaluated for reallocation.

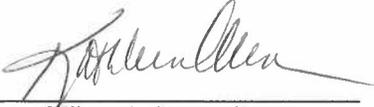
